Hosting a tournament, whether a social "round robin" or a competitive DUPR event, brings players together for "rallies" and "putaways." This guide, crafted by alishuttler.com, provides a 10-step plan to organize a seamless 2025 tournament. 2 Why Host a Pickleball Tournament?

Tournaments spark community, competition, and fun. Heres why theyre a hit:

- Community Building: Connect "picklers" from beginners practicing "dinks" to pros landing "nasty Nelsons."
- Inclusive Play: Formats like "popcorn" doubles ensure no early "x-outs."
- **Growth**: With Indias pickleball scene growing (e.g., AIPA events), tournaments attract players and sponsors.
- Fun: Multiple "matches" keep everyone engaged, avoiding "getting pickled."

3 Step-by-Step Guide to Planning Your Tournament

3.1 Define Your Goals

- **Type**: Social "OPA!" mixer, competitive DUPR event, or charity fundraiser?
- Audience: Beginners, juniors (719), or pros? Choose "singles," "doubles," or "mixed doubles."
- Scale: Small (812 players, 12 courts) or large (40+ players, 4+ courts)? One court per 6 players is ideal, per Pickleheads.

3.2 Choose the Right Format

- Round Robin: Everyone plays each other, perfect for social play. Use our Round Robin Generator.
- Elimination: Single or double elimination for high stakes.
- **Popcorn**: Random partner rotations for fun, as Sharon Ricci suggests.
- Swiss-System: Matches similar-skilled players, great for DUPR.
- **Tip**: Use "rally scoring" for large groups to speed up games.

3.3 Secure a Venue

- Courts: Ensure 20x44 ft courts with clear "kitchen" lines and proper "net height" (36 ends, 34 center).
- Find Courts: Use our Court Finder for local venues.

• Backup: Bring portable nets (e.g., ONIX 2-in-1) for non-traditional spaces.

3.4 Set Date and Schedule

- **Timing**: Choose weekends or holidays; check weather for outdoor courts.
- **Duration**: 34 hours for 812 players (711 rounds); 68 hours for larger events.
- Scheduling: Use our Round Robin Generator for matchups and "byes."
- Tip: Plan 1520 minutes per game to 11, win by 2.

3.5 Promote Your Event

- Online: Share on Twitter and local WhatsApp groups, inspired by @majorleaguepb.
- Flyers: Create posters with Canva for community boards or Instagram.
- **Newsletter**: Announce via alishuttler.coms newsletter, linking to our Generator.

3.6 Register Players and Collect Fees

- **Registration**: Use a Google Form on alishuttler.com for names and DUPR ratings.
- Fees: \$10\$50 for competitive events; keep social events free, per Pickleball Den.
- Skill Matching: Use our Skill Quiz to prevent "sandbagging."

3.7 Prepare Equipment

- **Paddles/Balls**: Regulation paddles (max 24 combined length/width) and balls (26-hole indoor, 40-hole outdoor).
- **Nets/Lines**: Confirm venue nets or bring portable ones; use tape for lines.
- Scorekeeping: Use our Sandras Pickleball Scorecard.

3.8 Run the Tournament

- Check-In: Distribute schedules via our Generator.
- Rules: Brief on "double bounce rule" and "non-volley zone," per our Dictionary.
- Flow: Assign monitors to track scores and avoid "distraction" faults.

3.9 Engage Players and Spectators

- Prizes: Offer paddles or overgrips for "golden ticket" winners.
- Videos: Record "smash" highlights with our Video Analysis Tool.
- **Updates**: Post standings on alishuttler.com or Twitter.

3.10 Wrap Up and Follow Up

- Winners: Announce via our Generator standings.
- Feedback: Send a Google Form survey, per The Pickler.
- Share: Post results on alishuttler.com for next time.
